- 1. The Chairman, Barbara Savage, opened the meeting.
- 2. Apologies were received from: Maggie Brown; Diane Wright; Jan Addiscott.
- 3. The Minutes of the AGM held in July 2022 were accepted as a true record Proposed by: Penny Tytler, Seconded by: Christine Sheardown.
- 4. Barbara Savage read the Chairman's Report. She said that it had been a much happier year for the Society now that we are free from Covid restrictions, and thanked the committee for their hard work. As well as the excellent lectures, Barbara mentioned the visits to Brodsworth Hall and Elton Hall, the Spring Social lunch and the Day of Special Interest last October, adding that another Day of Special Interest is planned for this coming October. Our charity work continues with a grant this year to help aspiring young musicians, and our heritage volunteering work has flourished with book conservation projects at Thrumpton Hall and Nottinghamshire County Cricket Club, as well as a textiles project at Wollaton Hall. We finish the year with a stall at the Radcliffeon-Trent Carnival which we hope will take awareness of our Society to a wider audience.

"Tempus fugit!

The time has passed so guickly since our last AGM – and since Trent's birth in 2016.

We passed our 75th lecture and have enjoyed another full year of activities.

The Covid period seemed to negatively impact many social groups but Trent has been fortunate that our membership has thrived.

I thank you all for your continued support. We must all thank the committee for continuing to smoothly run our affairs, and for the welcome from them that I hope we all feel.

The first social event this year was the Study Day held 24 October 2023 at the Methodist Hall in Bingham when the very able lecturer Daniel Evans gave 3 very well illustrated talks about Italian Renaissance Gardens and their villas.

A treat for historians and gardeners alike. The busy and informative day was relaxed by the refreshing coffee break and excellent lunch. Thank you to those who organised and administered the event. [Sadly, I was out of action at the time and missed it!]

The second social event of 23/24 will be the coach trip on 21 May to Ely and the splendid cathedral. I feel sure that the coach load of members and friends are all ready to enjoy a wonderful day of history and architecture – and stained glass!

Our charitable work continued in the able hands of our Heritage Volunteers led by Tessa Day. They have completed much cataloguing of books at both Trent Bridge cricket ground, an at Thrumpton Hall – and costumes have been constructed for Wollaton Hall Museum.

We pursued publicity for Trent in November 2023, this time in the Bingham area where we had a stall in the Community Market. Some interest was shown resulting in new membership.

The New Governance proposals circulated by HQ hit us in January this year. It was a lengthy, legalistic and complicated set of documents the consideration of which caused the committee considerable work and soul searching.

The original voting for the proposals was to be in April. We chose to vote against the proposals. Then as a result of challenges by local societies and subsequent amendments being made, the EGM and voting is now deferred until June 3rd. Therefore at the time of writing this report there is no decision.

All that said, I feel confident that whatever is eventually decided about the Society's "Governance", the future of Trent is secure, and that our month-by-month lectures and social events will carry on "undisturbed".

We know that, at Trent, we have in you a loyal and appreciative membership. However we always need some help either from volunteers or committee members!!

Finally, this is my very last year on your committee. I have thoroughly enjoyed my 7 years being part of Trent's launch and success. Creating the earlier programmes was fun and interesting, plodding through Covid zoom meetings was a muddy but an interesting learning curve, and then finally settling down as Chairman before retiring.

My thanks to everyone behind the scenes who make our meetings so successful – our committee, our hospitality and reception teams and those who always manage to keep our technology working – but most of all – your good selves for attending in great numbers. You are the reason for our success.

I wish you all well and look forward with curiosity to see what The Arts Society as a whole will be like in the years to come.

Treasurer's Report for Year to 31st March 2024

This has been a fairly satisfactory year from a financial point of view although expenditure has exceeded income by a small percentage.

However, expenses are increasing year on year - hall hire costs have increased by about 10% and lecturers' fees and travel by a similar percentage.

To maintain a viable future for our Society we have found it necessary to increase the annual subscription by £5 to £55, only the second increase since we founded Arts Society Trent Valley almost 10 years ago (our first meeting was in October 2016 when the annual Subscription was £45).

Whilst our closing bank balance at 31st March 2024 might appear substantial it really only represents a notional reserve adequate to cover ongoing costs for about 16 or 17 months assuming those costs remain steady which is in itself an optimistic view to take.
